School Overview

Voyagers' Community School is an independent, progressive day school serving students from infancy through Grade 12. Located on the Brookdale Community College campus in Lincroft, New Jersey, the school serves families throughout Monmouth County and the surrounding region. Students engage in a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum emphasizing intellectual inquiry, individualized instruction, interdisciplinary study, and authentic application of learning.

Educational Philosophy

Students progress through a continuum of increasing academic challenge based on demonstrated readiness rather than age or grade level alone. Small classes and close faculty mentorship allow teachers to individualize instruction while maintaining rigorous expectations and fostering increasing independence.

Academic Approach

Voyagers' Community School provides a rigorous education that combines strong academic foundations with authentic application. Students engage in intensive study of literature, writing, mathematics, laboratory science, humanities, world languages, and the arts while developing the habits of inquiry, communication, entrepreneurship, and critical thinking essential for success in college and life.

Learning extends beyond the classroom through interdisciplinary projects, internships, dual-enrollment coursework, entrepreneurship, independent study, and a Senior Capstone experience that encourage increasing independence, responsibility, and purposeful engagement with the world.

Distinctive Features of the Upper School

Voyagers' High School intentionally combines rigorous college-preparatory academics with authentic, real-world learning. Through a four-year progression of increasing independence, students engage in internships, entrepreneurship, independent study, dual-enrollment coursework, and a Senior Capstone that enable them to apply academic knowledge while developing the initiative, resilience, and problem-solving skills essential for success in college and beyond. Located on the Brookdale Community College campus, students experience a gradual transition to college expectations through access to college coursework and resources while remaining fully supported by Voyagers' faculty.

Students advance through four stages of increasing independence:

Grade 9 - THINKING – Building strong academic habits and intellectual curiosity.

Grade 10 - DESIGNING – Applying knowledge through inquiry, collaboration, and innovation.

Grade 11 - LAUNCHING – Expanding learning through internships, entrepreneurship, and college coursework.

Grade 12 - GROWING – Demonstrating readiness through leadership, advanced projects, and a Senior Capstone.

To provide colleges with a more complete understanding of each graduate, Voyagers' supplements the traditional academic transcript with a Voyager Profile which documents internships, leadership, entrepreneurship, college coursework, significant projects, and demonstrations of learning that extend beyond the traditional transcript.

Course of Studies

Rather than offering AP or IB courses, Voyagers provides faculty-approved Honors coursework, dual-enrollment opportunities through Brookdale Community College, and advanced independent study designed to challenge students according to their readiness and interests.

Students complete a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum that includes:

Assessment & Grading

Voyagers' Community School operates on a trimester system. The cumulative grade point average (GPA) is calculated using all coursework completed in Grades 9–12. One additional quality point is awarded for each approved Honors course. Because of the school's small graduating classes, Voyagers' does not report class rank.

Student achievement is assessed through multiple measures, including coursework, projects, presentations, examinations, and authentic demonstrations of learning. Final course grades are assigned by faculty and reflect each student's demonstrated mastery of course expectations. Narrative evaluations complement letter grades by providing colleges with additional insight into each student's intellectual growth, learning habits, strengths, and overall development.

SAT/ACT

Students are prepared for standardized testing through a comprehensive college-preparatory curriculum. Because many students apply to test-optional institutions, standardized testing is encouraged but not required. Students are counseled individually to determine whether submitting standardized test scores will strengthen their college applications.

Over the past five graduating classes, 93% of graduates have matriculated at four-year colleges and universities.
